Solid waste impacts watersheds from rivers to the sea, where it is washed away. Waste management and interception of waste being dispersed to the environment are key to reducing water pollution.

Plastic is the most common type of waste found in aquatic environments. The ongoing work on the plastic treaty invites us to think about reducing its use, but also about improving the management of plastic waste. Collaboration between managers of watersheds, coastal and maritime areas and waste managers is necessary to protect aquatic environments biodiversity, the quality of water resources and human health, as well as local economic development.

The first part of the session will provide a global perspective on waste management and its pollution impacts, from waterways to coastal ecosystems. The second part will focus on the Indonesian context.
